

Year 1 Spellings



In Year I we need to practise reading and spelling a variety of 'tricky words'.

These are words that are hard to sound out and need to be read and spelt by sight.

Practising these and applying them in a variety of contexts helps your child develop their vocabulary skills, accuracy and confidence.

We will allow a variety of opportunities for children to spell these words correctly and apply to dictated sentences.

Below are a variety of examples of how you can practise these spellings at home with your child.

Look, Say, Cover, Write, Check

- I. Look at the word, what is the first letter? Look all the way through the word, notice word parts.
- 2. Say the word. Stretch the word out.
- 3. Cover the word. Spell the word 'no peeking!'
- 4. Write the word.
- 5. Check if you spelled it correctly. Edit if needed.

Keep Copying


Write your words out three times each. Use different colours if you want to.
