Text Focus: Bedtime for Monsters and Gruffalo

- Start new phonics groups your child may have a teacher who is not their class teacher for Phonics.
- Read CVC words
- Begin to read short phrases/sentences
- Read some set I red words
- Use and understand recently introduced vocabulary during discussions about stories, non-fiction, rhymes and poems.
- Start to develop phonic knowledge by writing some recognisable letters in sequence.

Expressive arts and design

- Perform song, rhymes, stories and poems with others moving in time to the music.
- Safely use and explore a variety of materials, tools and techniques, experimenting with colour, design, texture, form and function.

Personal, social and emotional development

- Understand how to persevere when tackling challenges.
- Recount times when we persevered towards a goal.
- Set a goal and work towards it.
- Use kind words to encourage people
- Say how I feel when I achieve a goal.

Communication and language
